CME1210: The Crossover day

The course in Integration and Orientation is developed in cooperation between the three technical universities in the Netherlands: Twente University, Delft University of Technology, and Eindhoven University. The course has two purposes. The first purpose is to integrate knowledge and the second of the course is the orientation.

In the course in Integration and Orientation students from the 3TU universities work together to apply their knowledge and skills on a real-life case, which will result in a crossover and integration of knowledge from the fields mentioned above.
